Chase and Aycock Win Place In Finals at Orlando For Play-Off Today

Orlando, April 15.—The fourteenth annual golf tournament
of the Florida State Golf association was awarded to Jacksonville at a meeting of the association here tonight, the tourney to
be held in the spring of 1928.
Officers elected were: Frank
Rogers, president; Fred W. Eansor, vice president, and J. S.
Sasse, secretary-treasurer, all of
Jacksonville.

Orlando, April 15.—Lee Chase, of
Miami, and Tommy Aycock, of Jacksonville, fought their way into the
finals of the 13th annual golf championship of the Florida state golf
association here this afternoon by
brilliant and steady playing.

In the semi-finals Aycock defeated Lawrence Sherrill, of Tampa, 1 up, in 19 holes, while Chase beat Gorgon Gibbons, of Tampa, 3 and 1.

The Aycock-Sherrill match was by far the most spectacular played during the tournament, Aycock fighting an uphill battle after losing the first four holes in succession. The diminutive Jacksonville star was 1 up after the 17th, but missed a six-inch putt on the 18th hole, while Sherrill sank one from the edge of the green to even it up. On the 19th, Aycock drove squarely down the fairway, while Sherrill pulled his into the rough. Sherrill, however, made a beautiful approach to put his ball within 15 feet of the cup, while Aycock's approach stopped on the edge of the green. Aycock sank his putt while Sherrill's stopped short for the match.

In the quarter-finals, Aycock beat K. B. Smith, Clearwater, 3 and 1; Sherrill beat C. A. Roberts, Miami, 2 and 1; Gordon Gibbons beat A. C. Ulmer, Jacksonville, 3 and 2; Lee Chase beat H. K. D. Davis, Clearwater, 1 up.

Finals will be played over the 36hole route at the Orlando Country club, 18 in the morning and 18 in the afternoon.
