## Woulfe Captures Senior Amateur Championship

**Rick Woulfe** captured his sixth career State Championship winning the **2007 Senior Amateur Championship** as **Terry Louis** fought back from three strokes down to top the Super Senior division at **TPC at Eagle Trace** last month.

**Rick Woulfe**, of Fort Lauderdale, claimed his first individual State Championship winning the Senior Amateur Championship by three strokes. After 36 holes, Woulfe held a four stroke lead shooting rounds of 72-70. "I couldn't have played any better," said Woulfe. "In the first two rounds, I hit 16 greens." With the morning shotgun called due to bad weather, the leaders went off in the afternoon for the final round. "It was a tough day," said

Woulfe. **"It's about time," said Woulfe about winning an individual Championship.** "The weather got better but the golf course played really hard." Woulfe's

final round 77 was enough to secure him the title. "It's about time," said Woulfe. In the first two rounds, Woulfe three putted only once while in the final round, he three putted four times. "I didn't play poorly," said Woulfe. "I just wasn't as aggressive as I was the first two days." Woulfe, the 2005 and 2006 Senior Player-of-the-Year, has won five team State Championships and has also had a successful run with the Society of Seniors (SOS). Last season, he won all three SOS major Championships, the first time anyone has accomplished such a feat. In second place, **Steve Earsley**, of Hobe Sound, shot consistent rounds of 75-72-75—222 as **John Darr**, of Gainesville, placed third shooting a 72-75-76—223.

## Amateur Deadline Nears

The **90th Amateur Championship** is right around the corner as the May 9 deadline quickly approaches. The 2007 Amateur Championship will head to the west coast this year and play at the **Innisbrook Resort & Golf Club** in Palm Harbor, just outside of Tampa, on June 21-24. First, competitors must attempt to qualify at one of 13 sites across the state. The top amateurs in the state will then advance to Innisbrook for the Championship.

In the Championship, participants will play 18 holes each on Innisbrook's Copperhead and Island Courses on June 21-22. After 36 holes, the field will be cut to the low 70 and ties. The final 36 holes of the Championship will be played on the Copperhead Course, home of the PGA Tour's PODS Championship, on June 23-24.

# Bluewater Bay Crowned Interclub State Champions

Bluewater Bay Resort posted a 31-under par to win the inaugural Interclub Team State Championship at Falcon's Fire Golf Club in Kissimmee on March 31-April 1. After six weeks of matches and two rounds of play-offs, Bluewater Bay beat out four other Regional Champions to be crowned the Interclub State Champions.

Bluewater Bay, in Niceville, held a four stroke lead after the first round recording a team total of 7-under par 641. Hal Dowden and team captain Dave Lavoie fired under par net scores of 71 in the first round to contribute to the team's success. In the final round, the team posted strong scores to card a 24-under par 624 for the victory. Carl California posted a team low score of 68 in the final round as Bo Burns and Hal Dowden each matched Dowden's first round score of 71 to be added to the team's total. Each day, Bluewater Bay's four-ball scores that were counted were all under par rounds.

Hunter's Green Country Club carded a 30-under par in the final round to jump into second place. Hunter's Green, in Tampa, was in fourth place after a first round total of 655 and made the leap into second place with a 618 in the final round. Tim Hume and Nick Meyer helped Hunter's Green in the final round each firing a 69. Miccosukee Golf and Country Club, in Miami, was in second place after the first round and fell to third place overall with a total of 1289. The Country Club of Heathrow took fourth place as TPC at Prestancia, in Sarasota, finished even par for fifth place.

In the State Championship, the best six individual net scores and best three four-ball net scores count for each round. Next year, the Interclub State Championship will be played the weekend of April 5-6 with a site to be determined.

## Winter Series Wrap Up

Samuel Martinez captured his second FSGA Winter Series division title of the season at The Majors Golf Club to top the 40-54 age division points standings as Kim Schwencke and Ray Darmstadt led their divisions for the second year in a row.

In the 40-54 age division, Samuel Martinez, of Miami, posted a tournament total of 221 to win the Individual Championship at The Majors by six strokes. Last month, Martinez also won the Victoria Hills event to put him in front of the division. By finishing the Series with the most points, Martinez earns an exemption into the 2007 Amateur Championship at Innisbrook in June.

Kim Schwencke, of Temple Terrace, wrapped up the 55-64 division points standings with a win at Victoria Hills. Schwencke, last season's Series division winner, also won

the individual event at PGA and a four-ball win at Dunedin. Schwencke also gains an exemption into the Amateur.

Ray Darmstadt, of Co-coa Beach, won his first event of the season at The Majors to lead the 65 and over age division and claim his second consecutive division points list. The victory in the Championship adds to his three second place finishes this season.

In the final round, Louis moved in front posting a 76 to win the Super Senior Championship with a 226 total. Louis, an alternate for the Championship, got into the tournament on Monday, the day before the first round. **Brian Sachs**, of Newberry, recorded a 74-79-74 to finish in second place just one stroke shy of Louis. In a three-way tie for third place, **Jim DuBois**, of Coral Springs, **Rennie Law**, of Tampa, and **Russ Berkoben**, of Naples, each shot a tournament total of 230. DuBois, the leader after two rounds of 73-74, fell to third place with a final round 83.

# Tend the Flag, Please

We've all heard or used the expression but what does it really mean? When can you do it, how do you do it, who can do it and

lastly why do you do it?

Let's start where most Rules begin and that is with the definition. The "flagstick" is a moveable straight indicator, with or without bunting or other material attached, centered in the hole to show its position. It must be circular in cross section. Padding or other shock absorbent material that might unduly influence the movement of the ball is prohibited.

Now, the Rules tell us that there is no penalty if the ball strikes the flagstick when you play from off the green. However, when your ball is played from on the green, the Rules prohibit us from getting that helping hand of the flagstick in the hole by assessing a penalty of loss of hole or two strokes if your ball strikes it.

There are actually three different things you can do with the flagstick before making a stroke other than leaving it in the hole. You may have it attended, removed or held up. If you request none of those three and after the stroke is made

someone does attend, remove or hold it up, a penalty will be incurred if the action might influence the movement of the ball. Moral of the story; once the ball is in motion, leave the flagstick alone!

First, you may have the flagstick attended anywhere on the course; even if you are not on the green. When the flagstick is attended, someone usually holds the flagstick so you can see where the hole is exactly if it is out of your sight and then removes it after the stroke. Actually, if someone stands near to the flagstick (near enough to reach out and touch it) without actually touching it, he is deemed to be attending it. Likewise, if someone attends, removes or holds it up with your knowledge and without your objection you are deemed to have authorized it.

Second, you may have the flagstick removed at any time before a stroke. This usually happens on the putting green to avoid penalty or when someone is chipping from just off the green. The flagstick is removed and placed on the ground out of the way to avoid having it struck by the moving ball.

Third, you may have the flagstick held up to show its position. This is usually done to an elevated green when the ball is played from below the level of the green. In doing so, the flagstick must be held directly over the hole dur-

ing the stroke.

Often in golf, if you are afforded a privilege, a responsibility goes along with that privilege. That being said, here is where the penalty of loss of hole in match play or two strokes in stroke play applies:

- If the ball strikes the flagstick when it is attended, removed or held up, the player who struck the ball incurs the penalty.
- If the ball strikes the person attending or holding up the flagstick, the player who struck the ball incurs the penalty.
- If someone not authorized to attend, remove or hold up the flagstick does so before the stroke, that person incurs the penalty.
- If someone not authorized to attend remove or hold up the flagstick does so after the stroke and the action might influence the movement of the ball, that person incurs the penalty.
- If the ball strikes the unattended flagstick while in the hole when the stroke has been made from the putting green, the player who struck the ball incurs the penalty.

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

## Four-Ball Deadline May 30

Entries close for the **58th Four-Ball Championship at Jupiter Hills Club** on May 30 with the Championship being played on July 14-15. First, competitors must attempt to qualify at one of eight sites across the state

From June 25 - July 3, teams of two will play 18 holes of four-ball stroke play in the qualifying in hopes of advancing to the Championship at Jupiter Hills, host of this year's US Open Sectional Qualifying and the 2008 Amateur Championship. The Championship will also feature exempt teams who earned exempt status through different categories. In the Championship, participants will play 36 holes of four-ball stroke play in the two-day event on the Hills Course. In four-ball stroke play, two competitors play as partners, each playing his own ball. The lower score of the partners is the score for the hole.

Last year at **Innisbrook**, **Edward Kenny**, of Lake Worth, and **Paul Melson**, from Plantation, shot a 69-66--135 to win the title. Kenny and Melson are exempt into this year's Championship and look to win another Four-Ball title.

Non-exempt players will attempt to qualify at one of six sites across the state in 18 holes of stroke play. Once in the Championship, participants will play an 18-hole seeding round with single elimination to follow to determine the Match Play Champion. The Championship will be played on the East/West Course at Sawgrass.

# Ocala Clubs Host Boys Jr

The **Country Club of Ocala** and **Golden Hills Golf and Turf Club** in Ocala will host the **53rd Boys Junior Championship** on July 9-11. Entries close on May 16 with over 250 expected entries filed.

First, competitors must attempt to qualify at one of the six sites across the state. Competitors will play 18 holes of stroke play in the qualifiers in hopes of advancing to the Championship. The Championship field will feature 168 of the top junior male amateur golfers in the state including qualifiers and exempt players. The field is divided into two age divisions; 13-15 junior division and 16-18 regular division. In the Championship, competitors will play 18 holes on each course then cut to the low 35 and ties in each division playing the final 18 holes at the Country Club of Ocala.

To enter, participants must be between the ages of 13-18 and not attending college. Also, the juniors must have a handicap index no higher than 17.4.

# Membership has its Privileges

Like American Express has always said “Membership has its Privileges”. This year, the FSGA is offering reduced entry fees and membership fees to individuals who have an FSGA handicap. We are also scheduling future competitions only at member clubs where we spend hundreds of thousands of dollars every year. (The FSGA pays for golf rounds, they are not contributed).

Why are we taking these steps? Very simply, the FSGA receives the majority of its financial support from member clubs that use our handicap system. Without their support, programs like the Florida Junior Tour, our scholarship programs and many of our state competitions would not exist. We are offering a discount to golfers on our handicap system because that very system is what keeps us in business.

The FSGA remains one of the very few associations in the country where you can play in competitions without having an association handicap. In other states, if you do not have a handicap through their organization – forget it – you are not allowed to enter any championships or events. (Please see: Georgia GA, Carolinas GA, Virginia, Conn., Mass., MET, New Jersey, Chicago District, etc...)

Some people have suggested that they can't control what handicap system their club uses. But that is not the case. We have had several hundred clubs join the FSGA as the result of their members' preference. You can make a difference at your club by stressing to management the need to be members of the FSGA. The FSGA membership might cost \$4 - \$5 per person more than some out-of-state

software company's handicap, but shouldn't your club be promoting and supporting golf in Florida? Isn't there still a need to do the “right thing”? Don't you deserve the best system and the member benefits? Shouldn't your club host an FSGA or Florida Junior Tour event and enjoy the resulting revenue?

It is regrettable that the FSGA has to push so hard to have the full support of some golf courses in Florida. But, our state leads the nation in corporate owned and managed golf courses and what's “good for the game” doesn't always matter to the corporate controller or members of upper management. You, however, are their customer and you can make the difference. Thank you for believing in the FSGA and thank you for understanding the need for your club's support.
