

Miller Captures Senior Amateur Championship

Tim Miller edged out the field by one stroke to win the **2008 Senior Amateur Championship** as **Bill Dorece** captured the Super Senior Division at **Old Corkscrew Golf Club** in Estero on April 15-17.

Battling brutal winds on this challenging Jack Nicklaus Signature Course, **Tim Miller**, from Venice, won his first Florida State Senior Amateur Championship by one stroke recording a tournament total of 232. After rounds of 80-77, Miller trailed the leader by one stroke heading into the final round. On the last day, Miller started strong making four birdies on the front nine en route to carding a 34. "I made some really nice putts on the front," said Miller. "I made a couple when I really needed to." Heading to the 18th hole, Miller had a one stroke advantage. "I just played it safe on 18 and chipped the ball short and two-putted," said Miller. Miller finished with a 41 on the back nine and 75 for the day to secure the title. "This is really special," said Miller, a two-time Indiana Senior Champion. "I have won a few things but this is my first Florida Senior Championship." **Bill O'Keefe**, from Fort Lauderdale, jumped into second place after firing a final round 73. O'Keefe recorded rounds of 83-77 the first two days to finish at 233. In third place, **Joe Records**, from Naples, posted consistent scores of 79-78-77—234.

FSGA to Conduct Florida Open

The FSGA is pleased to announce, that beginning in 2009, the FSGA will conduct the Florida Open Championship. The Florida Open will not be held in 2008.

The Championship will be reintroduced in the fall of 2009 and will include local qualifying throughout Florida. The event will be open to all golfers, and entry fees for local qualifying will be held to a minimum to encourage widespread participation.

The Florida Open has a rich history that dates back to 1942 with Lou Broward winning the first championship. Considered the premier State Open Championship, the Florida Open has been a launching pad for many great players including Bob Murphy (1967), Gary Koch (1969), Larry Mowry (1979, 1983), Bruce Fleisher (1980, 1987) and Bart Bryant (1988, 1994).

The FSGA is evaluating Championship sites and will announce a venue and date in the near future.

LaCita G & CC Crowned Interclub State Champions

LaCita Golf and Country Club earned 12 points in the playoff to win the **2nd Men's Interclub Team Championship** at **Tampa Palms Golf and Country Club** in Tampa on April 5-6. After six weeks of matches and two rounds of play-offs, LaCita beat out seven other Regional Champions to be crowned the Interclub State Champions.

After the first round, **LaCita Golf and Country Club** and **Miccosukee Country Club** were tied for the lead each gaining 302 net stableford points. The final round was cancelled due to weather forcing a playoff between the leading teams. In the playoff, all eight players from each team headed to the par 3, 17th hole to determine the Champion. Miccosukee got off to an early lead earning four points to LaCita's two points. LaCita jumped in front 6-5 and remained on top by one point with one group remaining. In the final pairing, Miccosukee went up 10-9 with LaCita needing to two putt for the win. LaCita gained three points making a birdie putt to clinch the victory 12-10.

After two rounds of playoffs, **LaCita Golf and Country Club**, in Titusville, emerged as the East Central Region Champions. **Miccosukee Country Club**, from Miami, claimed the Southeast Region title, **Eagle Ridge Golf Club**, in Summer-

field, claimed the Northeast Region, **Bluewater Bay Resort**, in Niceville, won the Northwest Region, **Tampa Bay Golf and Country Club**, in San Antonio, captured the West Central Region, **TPC Prestancia**, from Sarasota, won the Sun-coast Region, **Lake Ashton Golf Club**, in Lake Wales, won the Tampa Bay Region, and **Wilderness Country Club**, from Naples, won the Southwest title.

The Interclub began in January and included six weeks of home and away matches, followed by regional play-offs and a State Championship at Tampa Palms. Matches are played weekly and utilize full handicaps (18.4 indexes and below) featuring eight players

from each team competing against another local club in an individual 18-hole match and play with a partner in a four-ball match against two players from the opposing team (2-man, best ball). Visit <http://interclub.fsga.org/> for more on the Interclub.

Winter Series Wrap Up

Dennis Monahan won the 40-54 age division title as **John Darr** captured the 55-64 age division and **John O'Donovan** won the 65 and over age division of the 54-hole final FSGA Winter Series event at **Bent Tree Country Club** in Sarasota on March 30-April 1. This final individual event wrapped up the Winter Series points race as **Sam Martinez**, **Kim Schwencke** and **Edward Craig** topped their respective divisions.

After 54 holes, **Dennis Monahan**, **Jon Tingley** and **Jose Novo** were tied for the top spot in the 40-54 age division finishing with a 218 tournament total. In the playoff, Dennis Monahan, of Largo, secured the division title making birdie on the first playoff hole. In the first round, Monahan fired a 4-under par 68 to hold a four stroke lead heading into the second round of play. Shooting a 77 in the second round, Monahan found himself tied for the lead with Novo and **KC Fox** after 36 holes. Monahan proceeded to post a 73 in the final round to secure a spot in the playoff.

John Darr, from Gainesville, captured the 55-64 age division recording a 54-hole total of 217. Darr shot a 72-71 to sit one stroke back from the leader heading into the final round. Darr moved into first place shooting a 74 in the final round to claim his first title of the season.

In the 65 and over age division, **John O'Donovan**, from Ada, MI, edged out the field by one stroke to win with a 225 total. O'Donovan posted a pair of 74's the first two rounds and clinched the title with a 77 in the final round.

This event wrapped up the 2007-2008 FSGA Winter Series. **Sam Martinez**, of Miami, won his second consecutive 40-54 age division points race. Martinez won the individual event at Queen's Harbour and placed in the top three in each of the four-ball events. In the 55-64 age division, **Kim Schwencke**, of Temple Terrace, topped the division points standings for the third straight year. Schwencke won two four-ball events and placed in the top ten of the individual events played in this season including a second place finish at Duran. **Edward Craig**, of Orlando, won the 65 and over points standings with four victories. Craig, the 2005 Senior Amateur Champion, captured three individual titles and one four-ball event.

In the Super Senior Division, **Bill Dorece**, from Pompano Beach, captured the title shooting a 234 for the three days. Dorece shot a pair of 79's the first two rounds to sit one back from the leaders heading into the final round. Starting on #10 in the final round, Dorece made three birdies to make the turn at 1-under 35. On the front, Dorece parred the first four holes and held onto the lead with a 41 to finish at 76. "A 74 was my target score for the round," said Dorece. "I thought I may have missed by a stroke but my 76 was enough." Playing in his first ever Florida Senior Championship, Dorece just started playing golf again last November after having a back injury. Second round co-leader **Stuart Young**, from Fort Myers, took second place two strokes back from Dorece. Young shot an 83-74-79—236. **Ray Darmstadt**, from Cocoa Beach, led the division after the first round shooting a 74 and posted an 84-80 in the final two rounds to place third.

What's a Hard Card?

Have you ever heard the TV announcer say “that’s one of the Local Rules they play on tour. It’s on their hard card”?

Did you ever stop to think, what is a hard card? It’s not a piece of computer equipment!

The simple answer is that a hard card is a collection of Local Rules and Conditions of Competition that are in effect for a competition. It may be for a series of events such as the PGA or LPGA Tour or it may be specific for a club, an association event or series of events such as the USGA or FSGA. The NCAA has a hard card for men and a different one for women. The Florida High School Athletic Association also has one.

Having a hard card saves the Committee the time and effort of having to write out all of the Local Rules and Conditions for each event. In fact, since the Rules and Conditions would be in effect for all competitions, the Committee would have them printed on “hard stock” or light

cardboard and distributed to all players so they could keep one in their bag for all of the events; thus the name “hard card”.

So what’s actually printed on a hard card? Local Rules may include how parts of the golf course are defined. These include out of bounds and ground under repair by white stakes or lines. Also how sod seams, obstructions, integral parts of the course, temporary power lines and cables and other things on the course such as wood chips and mulch are to be treated under the Rules.

How about the embedded ball Rule? You’ll find that on the hard card in nearly every competition in the United States. If it’s not on the hard card, you are only eligible for relief for an embedded ball in a closely mown area through the green (not the rough).

Additionally, some of the Conditions of Competition will be listed on the hard card. In general they will include specifications on equipment to be used such as types of drivers and balls that are listed as conforming on lists published by the USGA. And how about showing

up late to the tee but within five minutes? You’ll also find that one on the hard card.

A couple more you may find on the hard card is whether or not players can ride or must walk and if practice putting is allowed after finishing the hole. Those competitions that allow the use of distance measuring devices will post it on the hard card as well.

Does your club have a hard card? It is easy to put one together and post in the golf shop or locker room just in case someone has a question. I strongly recommend it to avoid a sticky situation like “is the embedded ball Rule in effect through the green” during the club championship!

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

TPC Sawgrass Hosts Four-Ball; Deadline May 28

Entries close for the **59th Four-Ball Championship** at TPC Sawgrass on May 28 with the Championship being played on July 12-13. First, competitors must attempt to qualify at one of eight sites across the state.

From June 16 - July 2, teams of two will play 18 holes of four-ball stroke play in the qualifying in hopes of advancing to the Championship at TPC Sawgrass, home of the PGA Tour’s THE PLAYERS Championship and site of next year’s Amateur Championship. The Championship will also feature exempt teams who earned exempt status through different categories. In the Championship, participants will play 18 holes of four-ball stroke play on each course; Valley and Stadium. In four-ball stroke play, two competitors play as partners, each playing his own ball. The lower score of the partners is the score for the hole.

Last year at Jupiter Hills, **Kyle Henderson**, of Clermont, and **Bryce Voisin**, from Orlando, shot a 65-68--133 to win the title.

Points will be awarded to each match similarly to the Ryder Cup to determine the winning team.

Orlando Clubs Host Boys Junior

Interlachen Country Club and **Country Club of Orlando** will host the **54th Boys Junior Championship** on July 7-9. Entries close on May 14 with over 350 expected entries filed.

First, competitors must attempt to qualify at one of the six sites across the state. Competitors will play 18 holes of stroke play in the qualifiers in hopes of advancing to the Championship. The Championship field will feature 168 of the top junior male amateur golfers in the state including qualifiers and exempt players. The field is divided into two age divisions; 13-15 junior division and 16-18 regular division. In the Championship, competitors will play 18 holes on each course then a cut will be instituted in each division playing the final 18 holes at Interlachen Country Club.

To enter, participants must be between the ages of 13-18 and not attending college. Also, the juniors must have a handicap index no higher than 17.4.
