

Carter Captures Mid-Amateur Championship

Steve Carter fired a three-round total of 213 to win the **Florida State Mid-Amateur Championship** at **Sawgrass Country Club** in Ponte Vedra Beach. Due to Hurricane Jeanne, the Championship was modified to a 54-hole stroke play competition.

Carter, of Jacksonville, posted a 72-67-74 to finish 3-under par for the tournament. On Friday, in typical Sawgrass weather, 20-30 mph winds, his second round score of 67 was the low round of the Championship. In second, four strokes back from Carter, was **2004 Mid-Senior Champion Rick Barger**, of Merritt Island. Barger shot a 74-72-71-217. **Scot Regner**, of Ponte Vedra Beach, recorded a 74-73-71-218 while the **2002 Player-of-the-Year Rick Woulfe**, from Fort Lauderdale, shot a 71-72-76-219. Defending Champion **Ryan Konkus**, of Hobe Sound, tied with two others shooting a 223 with scores of 75-73-75.

The Championship originally was 36-holes of stroke play qualifying over the first two days with the lowest 16 advancing to match play on Saturday and Sunday but was changed to 54-holes of stroke play due to the threatening weather. Competitors played 18 holes on Thursday and 36 holes on Friday.

More than 350 entries were received for this year's Championship. Participants attempted to qualify at ten sites across the state in an 18-hole stroke play format to advance to the Championship. After the qualifiers, 90 players completed the field for the Championship.

Barger Wins Mid-Senior

After more than an hour rain delay, **Rick Barger** beat **Gary Keymont** on the fourth playoff hole to capture the **Florida State Mid-Senior Championship** at the **PGA Golf Club** in Port St. Lucie on August 20-22.

Barger, of Merritt Island, was one back from Keymont, the leader, going into the final round. Playing the South course on the last day, Barger fired a 1-under par 71 and combined with his 74-69 finished with a three-day total 214. Keymont, of Orlando, shot an even par 72 in the final round to also finish at 214 and force a playoff. After both competitors made par on the first playoff hole, play was suspended due to bad weather. Play finally resumed and Barger and Keymont continued to make par on the second and third playoff holes. On the fourth playoff hole, Barger drained a three foot putt for birdie to clinch the Championship. The 2002 Champion, **John Corzilius**, from Englewood, shot a 73-74-70--217 to finish three strokes back.

Doug Snoop, of Apopka, posted a 72-72-74--218 to place fourth. Defending Champion, **Paul Melson**, of Plantation, recorded a 73-76-72—221 as did **Bret Voisin**, of Orlando, shoot a three-day total 221.

The Mid-Senior Championship is for players age 40 or older playing 54 holes of stroke play. The field is cut to the low 70 plus ties after 36 holes. Rounds one and two were played on the PGA Golf Club's North and South Courses with the final round on the South course.

The FSGA has picked its team to represent Florida in the 2004 Southeast Challenge Matches on October 16-17 at The Club at TwinEagles in Naples.

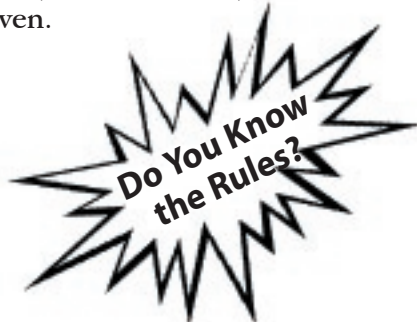
The Southeast Challenge Matches is a biennial match play competition with twelve-man teams from Alabama, Florida and Georgia. Four seniors and eight mid-amateurs from each state are selected to play in the Ryder Cup format.

Florida is looking to reclaim the title after Georgia won the Matches in 2002 with 26 1/2 points, Florida 19 1/2 points and Alabama finished with 17 points at The Ledges in Alabama. Florida leads the series with 5 wins, Georgia has 3 wins and Alabama won the Matches once.

Rick Woulfe, the 2002 Florida State Player-of-the Year, will lead the Florida team in the 2004 Matches. Woulfe, of Fort Lauderdale, was named along with the 2003 Player-of-the-Year **Andy Purnell**, of Jacksonville. Also named to represent Florida are Mid-Amateurs: **David Anthony**, of Jacksonville, **Michael Nealy**, from Boca Raton, **Doug Snoop**, of Apopka, **Frank Strafacci**, of Davie, **David Sutton**, of Maitland, and **Bret Voisin**, of Orlando. The top seniors selected to represent Florida are **Joseph Cristillo**, of Crystal River, **Steve Earsley**, of Stuart, **Curt Madson**, of Mount Dora, and **Bruce Scamehorn**, from Winter Haven.

Searching for a Ball in a Bunker

At the recent Mid-Amateur Championship hosted by Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach, a call came in on the radio about a competitor who may have moved his ball during search in a bunker. I spoke to the player involved and asked him to tell me what happened.

He explained that his ball had “disappeared” into a bunker and he began to look for it in the bunker. He did find the ball and in the process, moved the ball just slightly. He then said that he played the ball from where it lie without replacing it.

Has that ever happened to you? What’s the ruling?

There are different Rules that come into play in this situation.

Rule 27-1

First, the player is allowed five minutes for search; if the ball is not found in five minutes, the ball is lost and the player is required, under penalty of one stroke, to play a ball as nearly as

possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played (see Rule 20-5).

New sand or not, that means that you have to find it or it’s lost. Your caddie, opponent, fellow competitor, or their caddies, spectators and even officials can get in there and help look for it.

Rule 12-1

Secondly, in a hazard, if a ball is believed to be covered by loose impediments or sand, the player may remove by probing, raking or other means as much thereof as will enable him to see a part of the ball. If an excess is removed, no penalty is incurred and the ball shall be re-covered so that only a part of the ball is visible. If the ball is moved in such removal, no penalty is incurred; the ball shall be replaced and, if necessary, recovered.

When it’s clear that the ball will not easily be found, you can grab a rake or a club and start moving sand or leaves to see if your ball is in there. Don’t worry if you move the ball while looking for it. If you do find it in the bunker and move the ball in the process, you

need to replace the ball and recover it and leave just enough of the ball showing so that you can see it. No penalty is incurred.

Rule 20-3b (iii)

In a bunker, the original lie shall be recreated as nearly as possible and the ball shall be placed in that lie.

If you have made a mess of the lie in the bunker in the process of finding it with your rake or club or any other means and happened to have moved the ball, you need to recreate the original lie. If it entered into a footprint in the bunker, you recreate a footprint in the bunker and place the ball back into a buried lie in the footprint with just a small part of the ball visible.

In summary, if the ball is moved during search and not replaced or recovered as stated, the penalty is loss of hole in match play or two strokes in stroke play. **In this case, the player incurred a penalty of two strokes.**

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

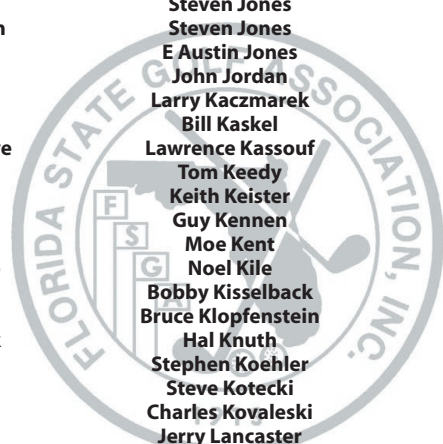
