Schulz claims State Amateur title

■When the 84th Florida State Amateur Championship concluded at World Woods Golf Club, it was eerily similar to last year's championship.

Robbie Schulz, a lifelong Miami resident whose family recently moved to Naples, had to overcome a 1 hour and 52 minute rain delay and then fire the championship's

low round with a 5-under par 67 to leapfrog the leaders and claim his first State title. Last year, **Justin Biggs** did the same thing by withstanding a rain delay and then shooting a 66 to come from 10 strokes behind and win.

Joe Alfieri of Lutz again finished in second place for the third year in a row. He shot even par during the final round to finish tied for second with Clearwater's **Brendan Takacs**. The duo was four strokes behind Schulz.

Schulz started the day four strokes behind third-round leader **Steve Albright**. After shooting back-to-back 73's on Thursday and Friday, Schulz made his move on a grueling Saturday. Following a six-hour rain delay, he fired a 3-under par 69 that included six birdies and three bogeys. He stayed hot on Sunday by adding six more birdies and just one bogey. The bogey came on 16 after Schulz had already built a four-shot lead.

Albright, who had led the championship since the first round, just never got anything going during the final round. He closed with a 7-over par 79 to fall to a tie for 8^{th} .

Kelly Gosse of Inverness jumped up to fourth place with a final-round 69, while University of Florida's **Dalton Melnyk** and Sarasota's **Adam Scrimenti** shared fifth place honors at 1-over par 288.

Schulz attended Wallace Community College in Dothan, Alabama this past year. The school has recently dropped its golf program, so Schulz is now trying to decide what the future holds.

"This is the biggest tournament I have ever won," Schulz said. "I'm trying to decide if I'm going to find another school and play collegiately or turn professional."

But it sounded like his mind is already made up. When later asked if he would be back to defend next year, he smiled and nodded his head yes.

Schulz received a crystal vase and his name inscribed on the **Clarence Camp** Championship Trophy. The top 10 plus ties will receive an exemption into the Florida State Amateur Championship next year. ®

First Off the Tee

Changes Adopted for Club Team and Two-Man Team

■We have enacted some changes that will affect the conduct of the Florida State Club Team Championship and the Florida State Two-Man Team Championship beginning in the year 2002.

The most significant change to the Florida State Club Team Championship is that a team will now consist of four players instead of five. The three lowest gross scores will now determine the team total.

Clubs will also be allowed to pay the entry fee for their team without jeopardizing the player's amateur status. Clubs are encouraged to select a team or hold a tournament to choose their players. Many clubs have also provided players a team shirt and hat.

More drastic changes have been made to the Florida State Two-Man Team Championship. The championship will be 54 holes over two days and will include both gross and net divisions.

On the first day of the championship, teams will compete in a scramble in the morning and a modified alternate shot in the afternoon. The second day of the championship will be best ball.

Four-Ball Title in Familiar Hands

Tampa duo wins an unprecedented 3rd consecutive title.

■Doug LaCrosse and Joe Alfieri won their third consecutive Florida State Four-Ball Championship by combining to shoot 11-under par over two days at Doral Golf Resort's "Blue Monster" course.

The duo took advantage of perfect conditions during the first round to post a 9-under

par 63 and take a two stroke lead over the rest of the field. With winds continually blowing at 20 to 25 miles per hour in the final round, they shot a conservative 70 to hold on for a three-stroke victory.

Orlando's Cap Caponi and Mickey Novak made a run by shooting a finalround 67, but they fell short and shared second place with Steve Albright and Kelly Gosse.

LaCrosse and Alfieri received crystal championship vases and had their names enscribed on the base of the permanent Florida State Four-Ball Championship Trophy. An old English plate two-handled chased cup designed by Henry Alkin in 1860 tops the trophy.

The title was their fifth in three years. LaCrosse, who is a four-time FSGA Player of the Year, started teaming with Alfieri in 1999. That happened to be the same year Alfieri was named the FSGA Player of the Year. They have competed in six state four-ball events and have now won five of them. The exception was a thirdplace finish at the Mid-Amateur Four-Ball earlier this year won by Albright and Gosse.

60th Florida State Club Team Championship

The second oldest championship on the FSGA schedule had a lot of sub-plots. Avila Golf & Country Club, located in Tampa, was trying to win their 10th overall title and their seventh in the last 11 years. Orlando's Lake Nona Golf Club was trying to repeat as

champion with a couple of new players on the team including Annika Sorenstam's husband, David Esch. But the story turned out to be the play of **Paul Melson** as he led The Club at Emerald Hills to the title.

Melson posted a tournament-low 69 in the first round to lead the team to a 301 total and stand four shots behind St. Petersburg Country Club. fall, posted consecutive even-par 72s to hold on for a one-stroke victory. With just seven holes to play, Gates was in control at 4-under par. Daytona Beach's Matt Every, who had claimed the 12-14 title in 1998, was making a run at Gates, but a double-bogey at 13 slowed him down. Still feeling like he had a chance, Every topped a fairway bunker shot on 16 and then had a 360degree lip-out birdie try on 17. It just seemed the championship belonged to Gates.

Every finished in a four-player logiam one shot back. Orlando's Gi Won Suh, Lake Worth's Tim Powell and Wauchula's Hiland Sanders joined the mix.

In the 12-14 year old age division, Jacksonville's Jimmy Plank closed with a 2-under par 70 to win by a stroke. Palm City's Greg Forest, who led the first round after a 1-over par 73, closed with a 74 to share second place with West Palm Beach's Kodi Merrell and Miami's Mike Stern.

Florida State Mid-Amateur Four-Ball(s)

Due to the popularity of the Mid-Amateur Four-Ball, we have a northern championship and a southern championship.

The northern championship went extra holes after Steve Albright of Ocala and Kelly Gosse of Inverness matched Randy Elliott of Winter Park and Wes Paxson Jr. of Jacksonville shot-for-shot. Both

teams shot 66-65--131 over the two days, but Albright ended things in a hurry with a birdie on the first playoff hole to give him and Gosse the title.

Doug LaCrosse of Tampa and Joe Alfieri of Lutz were leading after a first-round 64, but they closed with a 68 to just miss winning their fifth straight four-ball event.

Two other teams joined LaCrosse and Alfieri for a third place tie. Phil Eich of Altamonte Springs teamed with James Byrd Jr. of

Longwood to shoot 67 and 65, while the Winter Park tandem of Jack Richey and David Boesel posted back-toback 66's. Bill Moore and Phil Johnson, both from Valrico, were in second place after their first-round 65, but they dropped to sixth place after their final-round 68.

■The Florida Cup Matches is a special invitational event at the end of the year. The state's top players will be extended an invite on October 18, and then they will compete in a Ryder Cup-format on November 15-16 with North Florida competing against South Florida.

The South Florida team will have home course advantage with Lago Mar Country Club in Plantation hosting this year's event.

Players are selected using a combination of the FSGA Point's List and captain's choices for each team. Thirty-two players are invited with 16 to a team. Each team will have ten Mid-Amateurs and three seniors selected based on their standing in the FSGA Point's List. Two Mid-Amateurs and one senior will be selected using captain's choices.

Another special event scheduled for this year is the USGA State Team Championship. Three players will be selected on August 27 to represent Florida in this national championship at Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska, Minnesota. Played on September 23-25, the State Team has a team of top players from every state in the country competing.

Now you know the deadlines. The FSGA Point's List is listed in *The Member's Guide*, so look at the events in which you can earn points. With top finishes, you can quickly move up the rankings and be a part of a select group.

POINTS CORRECTION: Some players may notice a change in their number of points. There was a miscalculation in determining points, and this has now been corrected. The totals to the left show the correct points for players. You may have been affected if you finished in the top 25 of the 2000 or 2001 State Amateur or advanced to the round of 16 in the 2000 State Mid-Amateur.
