## South Team Claims Florida Cup Title

After winning the inaugural Florida Cup Matches in 1997 and then losing in 1999, the South Team reclaimed the Matches title last month at Lago Mar Country Club.

Both teams were tied after day one with 8 points each. During the Four-Ball round, the North took 5 points and 3 points went to the South. In the Foursomes round, the North earned 3 points and the South won 5 points.

Individual matches were played the second day when the South Team gave the North Team an "old-fashioned beating" by grabbing 10.5 of the available 16 points. The South Team claimed victory with their 18.5 total points compared to the North Team's 13.5 points.

Five players from the South stood out to help their team win the Matches. **Mark Leetzow, Brad Lanning, Paul Melson, Ron Cleland, and Chuck Smith** were each undefeated in all three rounds during the two days. No player from the North Team achieved this status.

A North Team member did receive some satisfaction from the event. **Cap Caponi** revenged his Mid-Amateur loss to **Paul Toliuszis** when the two competed during the Individual Matches. Caponi defeated Toliuszis 4 and 2.

# Improving Line of Play in a Hazard

**As I stood near the scoring area of the State Mid-Amateur at Interlachen Country Club in Winter Park I noticed a familiar player approaching who muttered to his fellow competitor, "I may not be able to sign that yet. I might have a rules problem."**

I called Skip Small, the Rules Chairman for the event, to come over and asked the competitor and his marker to step aside with us and describe what had happened.

The competitor proceeded to tell us that his ball had come to rest in a bunker near a steep lip. He attempted to hit it out of the bunker, but in doing so the ball had struck the front lip and bounced nearly straight backwards. He instinctively reached for the rake and smoothed the sand in the area from which he had just played. He then walked back to his ball that now lie in the same bunker and hit a sand wedge out of the bunker. He asked if he had proceeded correctly.

Our first reaction pointed us toward Rule 13-4 (Ball in Hazard) of the Rules of Golf, which deals with a specific incidence of a ball being in a hazard. The Rule carries a two-stroke penalty in stroke play when a player either "tests the condition of the hazard" or "touches the ground in the hazard...with a club or otherwise."

However, this Rule has two associated exceptions. The second exception to Rule 13-4 states "The Player after playing the *stroke*, or his *caddie* at any time without the authority of the player, may smooth sand or soil in the *hazard*, provided that, if the ball is still in the *hazard*, nothing is done which improves the lie of the ball or assists the player is his subsequent play of the hole."

We agreed that Exception 2 of this Rule applied and that raking the bunker while his ball still lay in the same bunker did nothing to improve his lie or assist him in the subsequent play of the hole. Had he either attempted to putt his ball through the raked area or had his ball come to rest in the raked area during subsequent play of the hole, he would have been penalized two strokes.

The ruling was made. No penalty.

This ruling was cause for later discussion. The talk centered not on a violation of Rule 13-4 but of Rule 13-2 (Improving Lie, Area of Intended Stance or Swing, or Line of Play). Some argued that the raking of the bunker on his *line of play* might have been cause for penalty.

The USGA confirmed our ruling of "no penalty" and pointed out that while the facts in Decision 13-4/37 in *Decisions on the Rules of Golf 2000-2001* are not analogous, the last paragraph of the Decision applies. That paragraph states, "Furthermore, Exception 2 under Rule 13-4 allows a player, after playing his ball out of hazard, to smooth sand or soil in the hazard, without restriction. This right supercedes any conflicting provisions in other Rules including Rule 13-2.

The card was signed and the player advanced to the match play portion of the championship.

# Toliuszis Wins State Mid-Amateur

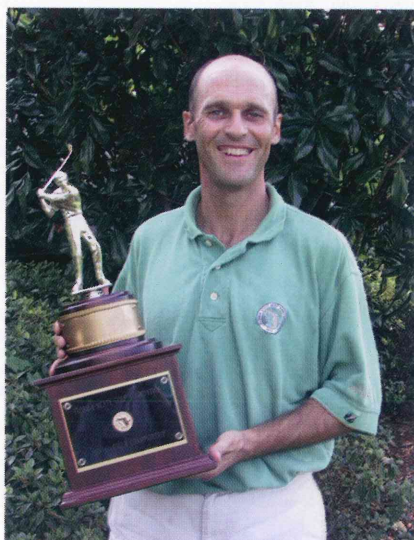
**Paul Toliuszis** of Miami Beach won the 2001 Mid-Amateur Championship in October at Interlachen Country Club in Winter Park.

In the semi-finals, Toliuszis defeated qualifying medallist **Brad Lanning** of Sarasota 4 and 3. The other semi-final paired Winter Park's **David Boesel**, a home course favorite and a previous champion, against **Cap Caponi** of Orlando. In this classic match play match, Boesel was three up through the 12th when Caponi birdied holes 13, 16, and 17 to square the match. On the 20th hole, a par four, Caponi won the match with a birdie.

The 20<sup>th</sup> hole is also where Boesel defeated Lutz's **Joe Alfieri** on Saturday to win the most exciting match of the tournament with an eagle from 170 yards using an 8 iron. Alfieri birdied 7 of the last 14 holes to take the match into extra holes. For the 20 holes, Boesel played 6 under par while Alfieri scored 4 under.

In the finals, Toliuszis established an early lead with an excellent short game and was 3 up after the turn. Caponi rallied on the back with long powerful drives and a fine display of putting, but in the end it was the steady play and consecutive pars of Toliuszis that prevailed.

Both players were invited to play in the Florida Cup Matches held November 15-16 at Lago Mar Country Club in Ft. Lauderdale. They also earned exempt status into 2002 Mid-Amateur Championship to be held at the Country Club of Ocala.

## Regatta Bay, Destin

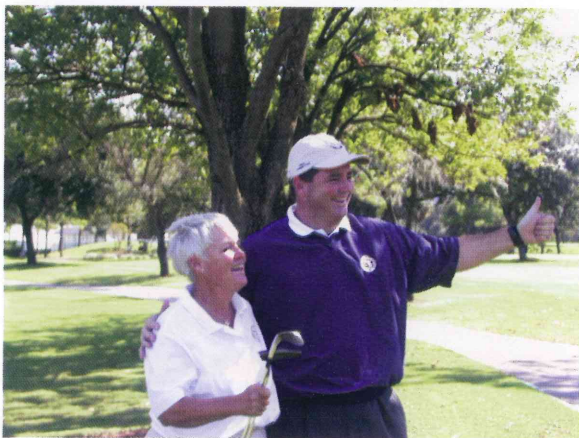
Several teams came in with a low gross score of 66. Nice scoring on a great course!
