KING NEPTUNE SET FOR APRIL 3-4 FSGA will hold its third annual invitational event in conjunction with the King Neptune Pageant at Sarasota's Rolling Green Golf Club, Saturday and Sunday April 3 and 4. Bill Watts, former FSGA President, St. Petersburg, is the defending champion and is expected to be back in the field this year. Entry fee is \$20 for the event which includes a practice round Friday and the "parade watchers" cocktail party at Sarasota Motor Hotel Saturday night during the highlight of the pageant. There will be prizes for gross and net competition (played on point quota system). The field will be limited to the first 160 entries. An entry card has been included in this newsletter mailing.

FSGA RETURNS TO ST. LUCIE APRIL 29 - MAY 2 The annual member tournament, and won by Ted Huff of Winter Haven, will return to St. Lucie Country Club this year. For many years this popular event had been held at St. Lucie. Complaints from the membership following treatment received during the 1969 tournament caused the event to be moved. However, Alan Bland, St. Lucie sales director, assures us that there is a new regime and attitude at the big resort complex and we'll give it another try. A Hilton Hotel has been added since the last FSGA tournament making St. Lucie's accommodation capability greater than ever. The Saints and Sinner's golf courses still are super tracks so we'll look forward to a great tournament. Entry forms will be in the mail by mid-March.

FAIRWAY AND SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS There will be a double - barrelled

awards observance in Sarasota Friday, April 2, prior to the King Neptune Tournament. Winner of the annual Fairway Award will be announced at an FSGA dinner planned for Friday evening at 6:30 at the Sarasota Motor Hotel. Nominations for the Fairway Award are now being received at the state office. In addition, five young men who have been recipients of FSGA scholarship grants will be honored. Michael L. Strait were awardees last year who have finished the course and are out working as assistant superintendents on courses in Florida and Tennessee. Dr. Gene C. Nutter, director of the school, is expected to be on hand also for the awards dinner. Wives and guests will be welcome to the event and those not already entered in the King Neptune tournament will be able to play golf that day prior to the dinner.

IAGA Meets In Florida

The International Association of Golf Administrators will meet in the Sunshine State for the first time. The session has been booked into PGA National at Palm Beach Gardens, March 17-19. Colonades Beach Hotel at Palm Beach Shores will be the headquarters.

Delegates to the conference, open to golf administrators only, will hear report on the recent nationwide IAGA handicap survey and a presentation by Club Management Information Systems. Other presentations and reports by administrators of national golf associations and communication media are on the agenda. Peg Burnette, representing the Golf Association of Philadelphia is the current IAGA President. FSGA will be represented at the meeting.

Rankin Wins Gasparilla

Always a popular winner, Bob Rankin, Clearwater insurance execu-tive, became the third player in history to repeat as a Gasparilla Invitational Champion. He topped the field at Palma Ceia Golf Club with a 36 hole total of 139 when weather stopped the action. Final day rains made the course unplayable. Harry Root III and Phil Leckey tied for second at 141. Rankin is a former FSGA State Amateur Champion, winning the crown in 1969 when the event was played at Longboat Key Country Club. Root and Leckey are former University of Florida golf team mates.
