

Interlachen Country Club Captures State Club Team Championship

Determined to improve their runner-up standing at last year's championship, the **Interlachen Country Club** team of **David Boesel, Jim Byington, Randy Elliott,** and **Joe Meier** won the 61st Florida State Club Team Championship at Port St. Lucie's **PGA Golf Club** in May.

After round one, Interlachen (Winter Park) was in fifth place shooting 225. Boesel led the team with a 73, while Meier and Elliott shot 74 and 78. Three teams were tied for second at 224, and **LaGorce Country Club** (Miami Beach) was in the lead at 223.

On Sunday, Interlachen's Byington and Rio Pinar Country Club member **Cap Caponi** came out and fired 69's - the lowest scores of the event. With Boesel's 70 and Elliott's 73 on Sunday, Interlachen finished 225-212--437 and won by 8 shots. This was Elliott's second victory at PGA Golf Club. He won the 2001 State Mid-Senior Championship here last season.

LaGorce finished second scoring 223-222--445. **Andres Gaviria** led the team posting 74-72, followed by **Scott Copeland** and **Bradley Hopkins** who shot 73-75 and 76-75 respectively. **Riviera Country Club** (Coral Gables) scored 224-225--449 for third place.

2000 Senior Champions Win Again in 2002


Cristillo and Harris Reclaim the State Senior and Super Senior Titles

Joseph Cristillo, Crystal River, and Bob Harris, Boynton Beach, gave repeat performances at The Forest Country Club in Ft. Myers with their second victories at the State Senior Championship.

Cristillo began the final day two shots ahead of **Tom Hayes** of Pensacola, who evened up the score by the 6th hole. By the 10th, Hayes was up to a two-stroke lead before a triple bogey on 15 put him back 2 of Cristillo. Finally, Hayes'12-foot putt for birdie on the 18th forced Cristillo to par the hole to win by one.

Cristillo posted 71-73-77--221 to win one over Hayes and Ron Cleland of Naples. Tying for second, Hayes scored 70-76-76--222 and Cleland posted 74-75-73--222. Cleland fought his way up the leader board the last day when he was tied for fifth with four other players after round two. Coming in with 77-72-74--223, Norman Swenson of Boynton Beach placed fourth.

Harris maintained his 5-stroke lead on the final day to win the Super Senior Division shooting 71-71-75--217. Bob Davis of Ft. Myers took second with scores of 73-74-75--222. The 2001 Super Senior Champion Hal Knuth of Port Charlotte tied for third with Tampa's Walter Baldwin. Knuth shot 83-73-77--233, while Baldwin's totals were 81-76-76--233.

Late to the Tee

It was 9:12 AM and Joe Doe (name changed to protect the guilty) was scheduled to tee off tee #1 of the Haig Course of PGA National Golf Club in the final FSGA Winter Series event in two minutes. He wasn't at the first tee or the tenth tee, yet he had checked in earlier at registration. I quickly pulled up at the practice putting green and practice range area and proclaimed in a loud voice "the 9:12 starting time goes in one minute!" A couple of heads turned but no one seemed to make a quick move towards tee #1.

A minute or so later I noticed a competitor heading for the first tee in his cart and realized that it must be him and a two stroke penalty was inevitable.

Rule 6-3a says that the player shall start at the time laid down by the Committee. The FSGA has the Note to Rule 6-3 in effect in all of its competitions. In absence of the Note being in effect, the penalty for being late to the tee is disqualification. The Note allows the Committee to provide in the conditions of competition (Rule 33-1) that, if the player arrives at his starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after his starting time, in the absence of circumstances which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of hole in match play or two strokes at the first hole in stroke play instead of disqualification.

Also, it is a policy of the FSGA not to look for a player who is about to be late for a starting time. Being on time is covered under Rule 6 which deals with some of the responsibilities of the player; not the Committee. If a member of the Committee were to search for an apparent tardy player, it would need to so for all players and not just a select few. In fairness to all, we leave the players' responsibilities to the players and concentrate on the duties of the Committee (Rule 33).

John Doe was upset when he was told of his two stroke penalty. He protested in vain that he had to use the restroom just before his tee time in order to avoid what may have become an embarrassing situation for all. Still, adding two strokes was the decision.


His final plea for leniency was that he was only 45 seconds late to the tee and did not deserve the full two stroke penalty.

If a ball is only two inches out of bounds instead of ten yards, should the penalty be any less? The ruling would stand, add two strokes and play hard. I think John Doe learned the rule the hard way. Get to the tee on time!

Junior Player Continues Golf Tradition

Third Generation Jamieson Competes in Scotland

Sixteen-year-old Robert Jamieson of Orlando is the third generation of the Jamieson family to compete in the Scottish Boys Match Play Championship. In April, Robert followed in his father's

and grandfather's footsteps by traveling to West Kilbride, Scotland, and playing in the prestigious event. First held in 1935, the Scottish Boys Match Play Championship is one of the Scottish Golf Union's flagship events.

Robert's father, Gregor Jamieson, is the Director of Golf at Orlando's Lake Nona Golf Club and Isleworth Country Club. He competed in the championship from 1970-1973. Bob Jamieson.

Robert's grandfather, played in the 1947 event and eventually went on to be the head professional at Scotland's Turnberry course for 30 years.

Other family members are also involved in the game. Robert's maternal grandfather, Dick Tiddy, has been the Director of Golf at Orlando's Bay Hill for more than 20 years. His sister Lesley is a freshman at Wake Forest University and a member of the golf team.

During the championship, Robert won the first round 5 & 4 before taking a loss the second day with a 2 & 1. He was also recognized in the press as being only one of two North Americans competing and for his family's history in the event. To be eligible to play, each competitor has to meet one of two criteria: 1) to have been born in Scotland or 2) to have one Scottish parent. Robert fulfilled both requirements - he was born in Irvine, Scotland.

Now Robert is looking forward to the qualifiers for the US Open, US Junior, and the US Amateur. As a high school junior, he is also visiting prospective colleges and looking at both golf and academic programs.


