MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR by Cal Korf

The season is almost over for 1993. The schedule for 1994 is almost cast in stone. We have a couple of changes which may be a disappointment to some of you; however, the end destination is only a deferment until the next year. Specifically I am referring to World Woods for the State Senior Championship and also the State Four-Ball. We have a wonderful relationship with the World Woods management and several candid conversations have resulted in our decision to defer our competition schedule there for one year. Principally their plan had been to have their clubhouse construction completed by early 1994; however, the planning stage is taking longer than the implementation stage and it is almost certain that the clubhouse will not be ready until early 1995. World Woods management concurs with the plan to defer for one year in hosting our series of championships.

Now for the changes. First the State Senior Championship. We have contacted Innisbrook Resort and the Longboat Key Club as sites to host the 1994 championship; we await their reply and will inform you of the outcome very shortly. The new dates for the Senior will be May 20, 21, 22. This is later than we normally have played the Senior, but we are trying to accommodate the popular and significant senior championships in late April and early May. It would be impossible to avoid any conflict, but we have hopefully avoided the most important. The State Four-Ball was also scheduled to be at World Woods but we will also move that location back to the ever popular TPC at Sawgrass. The dates will remain the same -- July 30-31. Format !!! Discussion has been held many times with your Executive Committee and Tournament Committee regarding the merits of conducting qualifying for the Four-Ball. After numerous discussions and many reasons we will continue to accept entries on a first come first served basis. We will also attempt to arrange another satellite tournament at Queen's Harbour. Those who played there this year discovered what a well kept secret and gem Queen's Harbour is. An additional bonus for those who play is that they will get a preview of the two courses to be used to host the 1994 U.S. Amateur in the last week of August.

Accolades are due to David Boesel for his tremendous showing in this year's U.S. Amateur at the Champions G.C. in Houston. David was in a play-off at the conclusion of the stroke play portion. There were 22 players tied with a score of 146 and only 11 places to fill the field of 64. David played at 7:00 a.m. and clinched one of the places on the first play-off hole the next morning. Later in the morning David played Scott Sterling from Texas who was tied for 3rd in the stroke play competition. David disposed of him 5 & 4. The next day David played John Pate from California (who is Steve Pate's brother) and David won 3 & 2. In the afternoon, David played a Walker Cup team member from England, Paul Page. Paul finished 2nd by one stroke in this year's British Amateur. After a lengthy rain delay, David went back out and won the match 4 & 3. After basking in the euphoria of winning his first three matches and having discovered that he would be exempt into next year's U.S. Amateur and next year's Mid-Amateur plus an exemption into this year's U. S. Mid-Amateur, David lost his cutting edge and had a bad start against John Curley of Massachusetts. David lost 7 & 6. A great tournament for one of our past State Mid-Amateur Champions.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT by Bill Erwin

During the July 10, 1993 Board of Directors Meeting, the topic of pace of play was discussed.

We have always emphasized pace of play in the past but we are aware that an even more concentrated effort is needed to keep in line with USGA, PGA and Golf publications who have all committed to speeding up play. Therefore, a pace of play action plan was put into effect immediately following the meeting. The Pace of Play Policy is similar to the following:

PACE OF PLAY POLICY

Tournament officials will monitor the pace of play and time individuals if your group is out of position with the clock or the group in front. The best advice is to be ready when it is your turn to play. The individual has 45 seconds to play a shot when it is their turn. The first player on the tee will be given an additional 10 seconds. Two violations of pace of play is your maximum allowance; the third notice of violation is a two-stroke penalty. Three violations could occur on the same hole without notice (tee shot, fairway shot and putt).

The above policy will be included with your pairings and can be found on the Tournament Information Sheet. We want to make everyone aware of the pace of play problem and provide solutions, as well as tips (see page 12 for examples) on how to be ready when it is your turn to play and what is expected of them. (Those of you who have played in championships [after July 10th] have probably noticed the increased emphasis on pace of play).

We will make a concerted effort in pre-tournament planning to consider field size, starting time intervals and course preparation (length and degree of difficulty depending on the caliber of players). We will educate our tournament officials regarding the pace of play policy and monitoring pace of play on the course.

Golf is much more enjoyable, especially at the tournament level, when we can play in a reasonable time frame at a reasonable pace. We at the FSGA are dedicated to this purpose. Your cooperation is essential and your input is welcomed.

Peter Ripa, FSGA's Tournament & Course Rating Director, adds the following:

The FSGA staff and volunteers during an event are on the course to assist play, not hinder. Our pace of play policy asks a walking threesome to play at a 13.5 minute/hole or a 4 hour and 3 minute pace and a riding foursome to play at a 14 minute/hole or a 4 hour and 12 minute pace. Each player is alloted 45 seconds when it is his turn to play. If it takes a player more than 45 seconds to play on three occasions, the penalty is two strokes.

If a group should fall out of position an FSGA staff member will warn the group. The FSGA staff member will track the time each member of the group takes to play a stroke. At the end of the hole if a player is in violation of the 45-second Rule he will be notified as to the number of violations. Again, a player could conceivably amass three violations on one hole, and be penalized two strokes.

Sure players feel that anxiety when a official is timing them but, the official feels the same anxiety. No official enjoys warning a group and then timing them. However, the Committee, by definition is obligated to apply the USGA Rules of Golf and FSGA policies equally to the entire field. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

INSURANCE AFTER "ANDREW" by Jack Veghte, Country Club Insurance

Hurricane Andrew went through South Florida over a year ago, August 24, 1992, but his effects on the insurance industry are still developing.

Eight (8) insurance companies were declared insolvent as a result of severe claims losses, a number of companies have withdrawn writing any new business or offering renewals, but just as important are the changes that are being made by the companies that remain in business.

In particular is the effect on insurance for Florida's 1,000 plus golf courses. Many of the insurance companies have adopted new guidelines in writing property insurance for country clubs:

- 1. Higher deductibles
- 2. Restrictions in coverage & capacity
- 3. Reductions in policy forms
- 4. Higher pricing
- 5. New geographic guidelines

The F.S.G.A. insurance program underwritten by Royal Insurance and marketed by local agents throughout Florida is committed to maintaining a market for F.S.G.A. member clubs. This is not to say that your 1993-94 policy will not have a higher deductible or some moderate increased pricing, but after paying in excess of \$2,500,000 to 35 member clubs, our program remains strong and viable.



LeCLAIR WINS STATE MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP by Peter Ripa

Gentle breezes and mild temperatures made for comfortable conditions as Ron LeClair of Fern Park claimed the second annual State Match Play Championship conducted at Wentworth Golf Club in Tarpon Springs.

A former Canadian PGA Tour player, LeClair, continued his brilliant play as he outlasted Jack Zeuthen of Winter Haven, 2 and 1. Although LeClair never trailed, he never lead by more than one until the 17th hole. "I hit the ball well for the first six holes and then just kept it in play," explained the 56 year-old, LeClair.

The Fern Park resident has missed competitive golf for seven of the last 20 years to regain his amateur status on two different occasions. In 1993, Leclair looks to play a full amateur schedule. "I never had the nerve for the game until now. Before, I used to be afraid to miss. Now I just get mad."

Tim Iley of Palm Beach Gardens managed to find his old form and capture the first flight with a 3 and 2 victory. Iley admittedly played poorly last summer but, has rededicated himself to his game. Iley's consistent play proved too much for Ron Hyde of Plantation. "Today, I just made no mistakes. This was the best I've played in a long time."

The second flight was won by Mark Pachan of Tampa with a 3 and 2 victory over Jim Beattie of Longboat Key. Local favorite and member of Wentworth Golf Club, Jim Trimble of Palm Harbor defeated Tom Handy of Sarasota after 19 holes in the third flight final.

Briny Baird of Miami Beach was the low amateur with a four-day total of 283 and tied for ninth place overall. The twenty-one year old Baird made 21 birdies, 15 bogies and a double bogey. The 52nd annual *Cadillac* Florida Open was conducted at Grenelefe Resort in Haines City.

Golf Professional Jim Chancey of Sorrento won the Florida Open title in a playoff with Adam Armagost of Jupiter on the first extra hole. Chancey's four-day total was 274.

The starting field of 198 amateurs and professionals played one round each on the 6,900 yard, par 72, West course and the 6,869 yard, par 71, South Course. The 36-hole cut was 149, six over par. The final two rounds were played on the West course.

FSGA CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL REQUIRE HANDICAP INDEXES by Kathy Naple

Beginning in 1994, the FSGA will require **Handicap Indexes** on all entries. Please be advised Handicap Indexes are different than a Course Handicap.

Excerpts from the <u>USGA Handicap System & Golf Committee Manual</u>: "Under the USGA Handicap System, the best 10 of the last 20 scores, compared with the USGA Course and Slope Ratings, are used to determine Handicap Indexes. A **USGA Handicap Index** is **expressed in whole numbers and decimal fractions**. The Index is then converted to a "Course Handicap" by means of a Course Handicap Table.

Scores on all courses, home and away, must be reported by the player, along with the appropriate USGA Course Rating and USGA Slope Rating. Away scores made in any state or foreign country are to be reported for handicap purposes. Additionally, when playing in formal competition, scores must be reported as Tournament Scores."

The eligibility requirement for entry into a FSGA competition is: USGA Handicap Indexes must be provided on all tournament entries. If your index should change from the time the entry is submitted, please notify the FSGA office of the change PRIOR to the tournament closing date. Once entries have closed, no changes will be made.

If your tournament entry is received without an **INDEX**, your entry will be returned and a spot will NOT be held for you in the event.

The FSGA is proud to offer the USGA's GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network) Handicap Service to all our member clubs. If your club does not have a handicap service and cannot provide you with a Handicap Index, please let them know this service is available at a nominal per member fee.

COUCH LAPS THE FIELD AT STATE AMATEUR by Peter Ripa

The final round of the State Amateur Championship began with a leader and the rest of the field, as eight strokes separated Chris Couch of North Lauderdale from his nearest competitor. The University of Florida junior fired scores only common at the professional ranks through 54 holes. Many seemingly insurmoutable leads though have fallen to complacent play.

Not so during this 20-year-old's final 18 holes. Couch started out by birdieing two of the first three holes to extend his lead to 11 strokes as his nearest competitor, Keith Rick of Boca Raton, bogeyed No.1. The next five holes Couch just kept hitting fairways and hitting greens in regulation for pars. On the 431-yard ninth hole, Couch sank a 40-foot birdie putt to make the turn at three-under-par 33.

On the back nine Couch's short game was tested as he made bogey on No. 11, failing to get up-and-down. After routine pars on Nos. 12 & 13, Couch's short game on Nos. 14 & 15 would allow him to save par.

Just as during Saturday's round, Couch would hit the 481-yard, par 5, 16th in two, this time just missing his eagle putt and settling for a birdie 4. On the par-3, 17th, Couch hit the green but, three-putted for a bogey 4. The par-4, 18th, now was the only thing standing between the North Lauderdale resident and the 1993 title. After a drive which barely found the left rough, Couch would hit his approach shot to within 6 feet. His birdie effort nearly went in as Couch had to settle for a par 4 and final round 70. The 12-under-par 276 total posted by Chris Couch was nothing short of spectacular.

Overshadowed by Couch's performance was the fine play of fellow Gator, Daniel Stone of St. Petersburg and Ohio State University team member Jimmy Bell of Orlando at 2-over-par 290. Just three strokes behind Stone and Bell was Isleworth Country Club member George Roat. In a three way tie for fourth were Keith Rick and Rick Heard of Boca Raton and comeback-story-of-the-week Mike Freeman of Riverview, all at 294. Freeman opened with an 82 on Thursday, then played the last 54 holes 4-under-par.

Yes, the 76th Annual State Amateur Championship, conducted at The Bay Hill Club in Orlando, was an amazing event for the 20-year-old, State Amateur Champion, Chris Couch. A total of 623 Florida state amateurs attempted to qualify, of which 120 players made it to Bay Hill. The site for 1994's State Amateur Championship is Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach. PACE OF PLAY CANMAKE OR BREAK A TOURNAMENT by Peter Ripa

Following a golf tournament, during the typical debriefing at the home club's 19th hole, the "war stories" of the past are told..."I had 220 yards in on No. 4, the pin was cutright, I hita 3-iron 2 feet; made the putt to go 1-under. Then we get to the par-3 5th, there was a group on the tee and a group on the green. We end up playing 18 holes in like 5 hours and I shoot 81, the second round didn't event matter to me."

Sounds like the player was just making excuses but, as administrators we have to listen, as the point is valid. Many of the positives about the event are forgotten when play is slow. The tournament loses its luster and players become uninspired by the experience, to put it mildly.

Who is at fault? There are times when slow play is a Committee error. For instance, a larger field sent out at inappropriate intervals, a lack of officials in trouble areas or a course is set up too difficult for the caliber of player in the tournament. These errors do occur but, we as the Committee try to learn from our mistakes and better prepare for future events.

Just as the Committee is prepared to do its part to promote pace of play, so too should the player. There are many reasons why players may play slowly. Some may have developed time consuming habits and are just not aware of them.

Here are some of the most common "time wasters" and remedies:

Lost Ball	Hit a provisional ball. Assist in search if your fellow com- petitors lose a ball, they may find yours later in the round.
Deliberate pre-shot routine	Practice a less timely routine. More than 45 seconds to play a stroke is a problem.
Not being ready when it is time to play.	Pace the yardage and make a club selection prior to your fellow competitors' stroke.
Looking at putts from every angle only when it is time to	Do homework and grooming while fellow competitor is lin-

ing up his putt. play the stroke.

All fellow competitors should Player in a rules situation play their strokes. Not a probl em in stroke play to play out of order. In stroke play, players may invoke Rule 3-3 (Doubt as to Procedure) if they are unsure as to how to proceed.

With a commitment to promote pace of play by the FSGA staff and members, FSGA events will be more enjoyable for everyone.






