LEON SIKES SR. WINS FAIRWAY AWARD, LEON JR. "PAPPY" EVENT VICTOR

Florida State Golf Association members and directors gathered in Avon Park February 14 and 15 to honor one of Florida Golf's greatest men, Leon Sikes, Sr., of Palm Beach. Sikes received the FSGA 1969 Fairway Hall of Fame Award during the two-day affair. In the 36-hole golf tournament held in connection with the award presentation, it was, ironically enough, Leon Sikes, Jr., of Lakeland, who bested his Dad and a field of approximately 70 other top amateurs.

Leon, Jr. had come to help pay tribute to his father and found himself the winner of the overall low gross honors as his rounds of 76-78, 154 edged Ken Sliz of St. Petersburg and Dave Crum of Lakeland by one stroke. Bob Grimsley of Tampa was the overall low net winner with a 36-hole total of 140, including a sizzling 66 on the final

day. In the Senior Division, for those 55 and over, Billy Watts, of St. Petersburg, won the low gross prize on rounds of 83-73. 156. He bettered the second place total of H. O. Davis, Clearwater, by two strokes. Rodney Karlson, of Vero Beach, took the handicapped, low net honors in the Senior Division with 144. In addition to the above mentioned winners, the following players took home prizes: Leon Sikes, Sr., second low net Seniors, John Geigley, Ed Randall, Vernon Lanier, Bill Rolleston, Fairway Committee Chairman, Harold Hayes, Don Ford, Cal Courtney, Larry Pickett, Jim Crisp, Joe Rood, FSGA President Bill Wodtke and Wilbur Boyd. In addition, a total of 21 players bettered the target score of net 76 fired by Leon Sikes, Sr. in the special "Beat Pappy Sikes" event

SEBRING'S HARDER HALL, AVON PARK G.C. SITES OF 72 HOLE TOURNAMENT

Harder Hall Golf Club in Sebring and Avon Park Golf Club in Avon Park will host the Florida State Golf Association's annual Member-Invitational Tournament April 2-5, 1970.

The event is open to all curent members of FSGA and the field is limited to the first 300 entrants. Both courses will be used during the 72-hole event.

Tournament headquarters will be the 41year-old Harder Hall. The hotel was built in 1929 by, oddly enough, Mr. Harder and Mr. Hall, two Miami developers. The hotel is completely air-conditioned and has 120 rooms and 13 suites. There is entertainment, music and dancing. The dining room is famous for its excellent cuisine. Tournament contestants and their wives staying at the hotel will have access to swimming pool, fishing ponds, sailboats, shuffleboard and tennis courts and much more for offthe-course fun. Use the reservation form on page three to secure a room for the tournament. All tournament connected banquets and cocktail parties will be at Harder Hall. Plans call for a cocktail party Thursday evening and a banquet Saturday night. Room rates for the tournament will be \$16 per person, per day double occupancy, including breakfast and dinner. Suites for three are \$15 per person, per day including breakfast and dinner. Singles are \$20 per day including breakfast and dinner. Contestants staying at Harder Hall will receive a \$6.00 credit for the Saturday night banquet.

The annual meeting of all FSGA members will be held on Wednesday, April 1, 1970 at Harder Hall. All current members of FSGA are invited to participate in this business meeting. Election of officers and

district directors will be conducted during this session. The meeting will begin at 10:00 A.M. and should conclude at Noon.

Norton Harris, veteran Florida senior amateur from Key West, is expected to defend the Member-Invitational title he won last year at St. Lucie Country Club. His 72-hole score of 288 bettered the second place finish of Roger Kennedy of Pompano Beach by four shots. Harris fired a final round 72 over a tough, windy Sinners Course at St. Lucie to win the championship. The Pompano Beach Country Club Foursome of Roger Kennedy, Roger Woonton, Glen Spoor and Hoagy Carmichael won the 36-hole team event with a combined score of 622. The FSGA Club Team Championship is played each year during the first two rounds of the Member-Invitational. Entry blanks are available to each current member-club. There is no entry fee.

Lots of prizes and fun for everyone are the highlights of this event. FSGA members are urged to submit their entries early for the Member-Invitational. Use the entry form on page three.

played during the first round. They received merchandise prizes.

Leon Sikes, Sr. received the FSGA 1969 Fairway Award at a banquet in his honor on the evening of the first day's play. The award cites his many contributions to Florida golf and his work with state, regional and national organizations of senior golfers.

Avon Park Golf Club hosted the event and FSGA officials praised the hospitality and help extended by the membership and staff.

Watts went on to dispell confusion with the Florida Senior Golf Association, headquartered in Tampa. "They have no connection with us or FSGA," he said.

Watts said he and his Seniors Committee are planning two events, one on the East Coast and one on the West Coast, probably at Punta Gorda, in the near future. These would be the first events, officially, for the Senior Golfers of Florida.

SECOND ANNUAL KING NEPTUNE CLASSIC AT ROLLING GREEN APRIL 18-19

FSGA will hold the second annual King Neptune Golf Classic in conjunction with the King Neptune Pageant in Sarasota. The 36-hole tournament will be played at Rolling Green Golf Club, April 18-19, 1970. The field will be limited to the first 160 entries. Use the form on page three. Entry fee is \$20 and includes a practice round on Friday, April 17 and a cocktail party and awards presentation immediately following play on the final day.

There will be prizes for low gross and low net scores over the 36 holes. Handicapped (net) play will be on the pointquota system. The system works like this: A players handicap is ten. Par (giving two points per hole for a par) would be 36. Therefore, the players "quota" is 26 points. Piayers earn points on the following scale: One point for a bogie, two points for a par. four points for a birdie and eight points for an eagle. Double bogies and up earn no points. Generally, the point-quota system is regarded as one of the fairest methods of handicapped play. The event is open to all FSGA members and you are urged to enter early. FSGA suggests you try the following Sarasota Hotels for accommodations: Sarasota Motor Inn, Cabana Inn, The Colony Beach Club, Far Horizons or Golden Host, There is also a fine Holiday Inn (North) and Howard Johnsons (North).

Brad Baldwin, one of the Tampa Bay Area's great golfing teenagers, took first place honors in the inaugural Neptune Classic last year. His 36-hole score of 145 tied Bobby McKee of St. Pete and Baldwin won the playoff on the first extra hole. Dr. John Mercer won the handicapped portion of the tournament with a Plus 15.

A reminder, a portion of the \$20 entry fee in the King Neptune Classic goes to FSGA's College Scholarship Fund.

How to Update Your FSGA Handicap Card

After you have renewed your membership in FSGA, you will receive a small yellow card in the mail. Please put the designated portion of the card in your wallet. The other portion of your card should be used as a current handicap register. If you will look on the back, you will see that a place is provided for you to update your handicap each month and have it initialed by the handicap official at your club.

When you enter an FSGA event, we ask for your CURRENT handicap (i.e., your latest club handicap) and that is the one that should be on the back of your FSGA card. It is up to you to maintain an up-todate record on the FSGA card.




