DAYTONA BEACH

Holland Aplin of Tampa and James Stone of Winter Haven combined for a 139 total and captured championship flight honors in the FSGA State Senior Four-Ball tournament at Indigo Lakes.

Aplin and Stone opened with a 70 and won the title with a closing round 69. The twosome covered the 36 holes without a bogey.

Dick Stackhouse of Boynton Beach and Don Whelan of Deerfield Beach finished second at 71-69--140 while first round leaders Tom Nichols and Bill Waggoner of Clearwater came in third with 68-73--141. They won third in a tie breaker with defending champions John Miller and Byron Swedberg and Tom Draper and Robert Ornitz.

Ed Analage and Graham Gammon won the first flight with a 144 total (75-69). Manuel Mones and Harry Smith won the tie-breaker for second place against Tom Grady and Bob Robison. Both teams finished at 146.

Former major league pitcher Lou Burdette and his brother-in-law Danny Williams combined to take the second flight with a 151 total. They edged out Jack Schwartz and Bill Winchester, who ended at 152.

In the third flight the team of John Crocker and Lynn Lee came in with a 151 for a five shot victory. Finishing second were Dexter Daniels and M.P. McInnis while a shot-back a 157 and in third place was the team of Gene Byrne and C.C. Smith.
