Pat Hopkins and Wes Paxson Jr. joined forces and posted a three-under-par 141 last weekend to win the Florida State GA's Four-Ball Championship at The Ravines Resort.

The Hopkins-Paxson combination carded rounds of 71-70 and finished the two-day tournament one shot in front of Mark Bucek-John Reeves and Dwaine Roney-Mike Wom-

ble in the championship flight.

Terry Crick and Dan Stone followed at 143 while the teams of David Boesel-Mark Pittenger, Corky Collins-Duke West, and Richard Hope-Dick Stephens came in at 144.

Jim McCumber and Carey Splane shot 145 while Tom Case and Bob Hughes won the final prize spot at 147 after matching scorecards to break a four-way tie.

In the first flight, Ron LeClair and Scott Stewart shot 148 to post a two-stroke victory over the father-son duo of Jack and John Veghte. Max Uzelatz and Merle Dixon were third at 154.
