

Veghte Leads In 40-Over Golf

Jack Veghte of Clearwater leads Sarasota's Ron Clayton by one stroke in the overall race heading into today's second round of the Life Begins at 40 Championship golf tournament at The Meadows Country Club.

Veghte shot a 69 Friday while Clayton had a 70 in the first round of the 54-hole tournament.

Three other players, including Bill Woods of Holmes Beach, were another two strokes back at 72.

The tournament is for players at least 40 years old.

In age-group competition, Clayton is on top in the 40-49 bracket, leading John Ward by two strokes. Should Veghte fail to hold on to his overall lead, he has a six-stroke cushion over four players in the 50-59 age group. Tom Hammons, Bob Redden and Dan Buckley are among the players who shot 75 in that flight.

In the 60-64 age group, Woods holds a three-shot lead.

Red Moran and Jack Bailey share first place in the 65-69 bracket after opening-round scores of 72. Lynn Conrad of Ocala and Harry Rhode of Palm Bay lead Bradenton's Rudy Laskowski by a stroke in the over-70 flight. Conrad and Rhode opened with 79s, Lawkowski had 80.

Sarasota's Clayton Takes 3-Shot Lead

Ron Clayton's second straight score of 2-under-par 70 gave him a three-stroke lead and the chase for the overall title in the Life Begins at 40 golf championship at The Meadows in Sarasota is threatening to become a two-player race.

Three-time state amateur champion Jack Veghte of Clearwater slipped to a 74 for a 143 total after two rounds of the tournament and is in second place heading into today's final 18 holes.

Third place belongs to Ray Robison of Winter Park. He is a whopping seven strokes behind Clayton.

Clayton, of Sarasota, is a two-time winner of this championship.

Should Veghte overtake Clayton in today's final round, the Sarasota golfer still has a golden chance to capture first place in the 40-49 age group.

Clayton leads that bracket by a comfortable 12 strokes over Winter Park's John Ward.

In the 50-59 division, Veghte leads Robison by four strokes while Ray Carter is at 150, seven behind the leader.

Carl Johnson of Tallahassee leads the 60-64 age group with a 36-hole total of 151, one stroke ahead of Charlie McCormick of Winter Springs and Bob Winchester of Melbourne. Two more strokes back is Bill Woods of Holmes Beach.

Clayton outduels Veghte to win Life Begins at 40 title

SARASOTA

Ron Clayton sank an eight-foot birdie putt on the 54th hole to edge Jack Veghte by a single shot last weekend (Nov. 8-10) in the Florida State GA's Life Begins at 40 Championship at the Meadows CC.

Clayton, of Sarasota, finished the three-day event, held on both the Meadows and Highlands courses, with a 212 total.

Veghte, of Clearwater and former State Amateur champ, led Clayton by one stroke after the first round, 69-70. Bill Woods of Holmes Beach, Red Moran of Fort Myers and Jack Bailey of Leesburg followed at 72.

Clayton added another 70 for 140 and a three-shot lead over Veghte after two rounds as the tournament became a two-man race.

Veghte trailed by one at the turn the final day and when he birdied the par-five 15th hole the match was even.

Clayton sank a 20 footer for birdie on 16 to regain the lead, but Veghte birdied the 200-yard, par-three 17th to deadlock the match.

Clayton's total also produced first place in the 40-49 age division first flight, 12 shots better than John Ward of Winter Park.

Veghte won the first flight of the 50-59 division, his 213 being 17 shots better than runnerup Tom Hammons of Longboat Key.

Charlie McCormick of Winter Springs won the first flight of the 60-64 age group; Moran was first flight winner of the 65-69 division; and Lynn Conrad of Ocala won first flight in the 70-over competition.
