HOWEY-IN-THE-HILLS, Fla. -- Roy Chenderlin of Oldsmar won the over-all title Sunday (April 5) in the fourth annual State Handicap Championship conducted by the Florida State Golf Association.

A former member of the FSGA board of directors, Chenderlin, 60, had a two-day total of plus-2 at the Mission Inn Golf and Tennis Resort. In besting the field of 128 contestants in addition to battling the elements, he was the only player with a plus total in the event which combines Stableford with a point quota system.

In Stableford, points are awarded for a score on each hole
-- one for bogey, two for par, three for birdie and four for eagle. A
player's point quota is determined by subtracting his handicap from
par.

Chenderlin had an 85 and was plus-1 each day. A 14 handicaprer at Innisbrook in Tarpon Springs, he had a point quota of 22 in each round. He had undergone major surgery in January and had only been back playing golf for a couple of weeks.

The start of the final round was delayed some 30 minutes by frost. Players were hindered both days by the cold and windy weather. The golf course, in superb condition, according to FSGA Executive Director Cal Korf, was set up to play about 6,400 yards.

Next on the FSGA tournament schedule is the State Seniors Championship May 8-10 at Grenelefe, near Haines City.
