Davis struggles on putts for 74

Not much happened Friday. Knapp shot one-under 71 and picked up three shots on the field. He's at seven-under 137.

Davis, who was one stroke back after an opening-round 67, shot 74 and is at 141. Bob Kouwe, the 1983 State Mid-Amateur champion who also opened with a 67, shot 76 and is at 143.

Dave Kartner of Palm City made the only real move, tying the low round of the day with a 70 to tie Kouwe at 143 and move within six strokes of Knapp.

Robert Ireland of Ormond Beach needed a par at the 18th hole to shoot 69. But the senior-to-be at the University of North Florida made double bogey and shot his second 71. That puts him at 142.

Greg Krak of Palm Beach Gardens also fell back on the 18th with a double bogey. That gave him a 73 and puts him at level-par 144.

For Knapp, it also was a frustrating day. Tee to green, he played well enough to shoot better than 71. On the putting surfaces, he struggled.

"It was just one of those days," Knapp said. "Every day you play you can't make everything you look at. It was a very ho-hum round."

Knapp figures he missed eight makable birdie putts inside 15 feet. He also missed an 18-inch putt for par on the 11th hole but came right back with a birdie at the 12th, reaching the par-5 green with his second shot, a driver off the fairway.

"He's got a real advantage on the par-5s," said Davis, 20, who played in the last group with Knapp. "He's hitting his driver so well off the fairway it's giving him a big edge."

Davis, who plays for the University of Kentucky, started out with bogeys on the first two holes but played well after that. He also had trouble putting and missed four putts inside 5 feet.

"If I get the putts to drop, I

think I've got a good chance," Davis said.

Ireland, 21, felt the same way. He got into trouble at 18 with a bad drive into a fairway bunker, but it was his putter that let him down. "I've just got to make some putts," he said. "I've been hitting the ball really well. I've just had a tough time putting on these greens. But I've still got two days. I've got a shot. I've just got to play tough."

Kartner, 40, works for Southern Bell and plays out of Martin Downs in Palm City. He finished seventh in last year's State Amateur at Lake Nona Golf Club in Orlando and thinks he can be a threat before the weekend is over.

"You've got to hope (Knapp) makes errors, which is doubtful the way he's playing," Kartner said. "It's going to be tough to catch him. He's not going to back up."

Kouwe, who lives in Tampa, had a double bogey and a triple bogey but played the other 16 holes in one under. At the par-3 second hole he tried to get too cute with a bunker shot and made 5. At the par-4 13th, he hit a cart path and took 7. Take away those two bad holes and he would be in good shape.

"I have to shoot two rounds in the 60s, no question about that," he said. "If Tom shoots a couple of good rounds, he's not going to be caught. But I'm going to be coming out firing for the pin. I didn't come here to finish second."

It was a particularly rough day for Mike Lefebre, the Bear Lakes Club champion. He shot 72 Thursday and was in good shape through eight holes Friday. He bogeyed No. 9 and came to the 10th tee a bit frustrated. Trying to draw his tee ball off the bunker on the right-hand side of the fairway, Lefebre snap-hooked two drives into the water and made a snowman — a quadruple bogey 8. That was it for him. He shot 82 and was right on the cut at 10-over 154.

"I played the back in 45," he said with a smile. "That's always a tough nine for me."

Knapp shoots 71, takes four-stroke lead in Amateur

WEST PALM BEACH — The 73rd Florida Amateur Championship appears to be Tom Knapp's to win or lose.

Bear Lakes Country Club is his home course.

He has a four-stroke lead over Robbie Davis of Lakeland after 36 holes and is going for a record-tying third State Amateur title.

At 43, he has more than double the experience of the two college kids he will be paired with in today's third round.

But wait. Knapp said it's way too early to begin engraving his name on the trophy.

"There's a long way to go yet," he said. "Anything can happen in two rounds."
