## HOLMES/LINDSEY TANDEM HOLD ON FOR SENIOR FOUR-BALL TITLE

Vero Beach residents David Holmes and Gary Lindsey held off a late charge by Bud Chapman, Boynton Beach and John Harrigan, Minneapolis, Minn. at the State Senior Four-Ball Championship, conducted by the Florida State Golf Association. The better-ball-of-two event saw 60 two-man teams vie for the 1993 title at the beautiful Quail Ridge Country Club (North course) in Boynton Beach.

A seven-under-par 65 during the rain-delayed opening round gave Holmes and Lindsey a two shot edge over their nearest competitors. During Sunday's final round, birdies were not quite as easy to come by as the team made the turn at just one-under-par 35. Meanwhile, Chapman and Harrigan would fire nines of 32 and 34 for a final round low of 66 and a 137 total, just one-stroke off the leaders' pace.

After a number of pars on the back nine, Holmes and Lindsey reached the 18th tee still one-under-par for the day, needing par to avoid a sudden-death playoff. Both Holmes and Lindsey felt the pressure, as they knew they controlled their destiny.

Gary Lindsey, who had kept the team in contention with some great pars on the back nine, would hit a poor drive on the 18th making par unlikely. It was now David Holmes who would have to forget the previous 17 holes and muster a par on the 376 yard par-4. A respectable drive left Holmes with 155 yards to the green. His approach would find the collar short of the green. Now just a chip and a putt separated Holmes and Lindsey from the title. Holmes' chip would come to within two feet of the cup. The Vero Beach resident hit a solid putt into the middle of the hole for the win. Friends and fellow-competitors alike applauded his fine effort, as Holmes let out a huge sigh of relief.
