

CLONINGER AND RIVIERE CAPTURE STATE FOUR-BALL

The popularity of the State Four-Ball Championship reached a new high as nearly 282 competitors took part in the 36-hole event. It took three courses to accommodate all the participants, TPC at Sawgrass Stadium and Valley, as well as, Queen's Harbor Yacht and Country Club.

The 1993 field read like a who's who in Florida amateur golf, including past U.S. Amateur, Florida State Amateur, and Match Play champions. Near perfect conditions allowed the talent laden field to fire some great scores over the 6750 yard plus Stadium and Valley courses.

In the championship division Rick Cloninger of Orlando and Steve Riviere of Apopka posted rounds of 69 and 67. The 8-under-par 136 total was good enough to force a playoff with two other teams. Local favorites Fred Klauk, superintendent at TPC at Sawgrass and Mike Bodney of Ponte Vedra Beach managed a 66 and 70 for a 136 total. The West Palm Beach team of Mike Lefebvre and Eric Schreiber also amassed a 8-under-par total completing the three team playoff.

The Lefebvre/Schreiber team managed a par on the first playoff hole. A scrambling Steve Riviere was able to sink a eight-foot par putt to keep his team alive. The Klauk/Bodney team now had the opportunity to capture the title, as Mike Bodney stood over a three-foot birdie putt. Bodney's birdie effort, however, would circle the hole and leave him with a tap in for par.

Call it luck or fate but, Cloninger and Riviere were given a new breath of life. On the second playoff hole, Rick Cloninger would make good on the opportunity as he hit his approach to the par-5 No. 2 green to within six feet of the hole. With the other two teams in the hole with pars, Cloninger would finish the team's Sunday charge as he sank his birdie putt.

The State Four-Ball title is Cloninger's second, as he captured the 1992 State Match Play Championship. Steve Riviere, on the other hand finally made his mark after many top finishes.

In 1994 the State Four-Ball Championship will change venues to the new spectacular World Woods and Southern Woods Golf Clubs in Homosassa Springs. Due to the anticipated overwhelming response for next year's event, be sure to check the November newsletter for details on format and entry requirements.
