WINTER HAVEN - Two Hillsborough County golfers lead the upper division of the Florida State Juniors Championship after posting matching 68s across the 6,200-yard Willow Brook layout yester-

Tampa's John Jones and Brandon's John Reger both carded 35-33's in yesterday's first round. They share a twostroke lead over Fort Pierce's David Abell, the FSGA event's current defending champion.

Abell fired a 34-36 to best par by two strokes at 70. The defender was tied for fifth place with Bob Williams of Fort Lauderdale, going into today's final 18 holes of play.

One stroke behind the leaders and a stroke ahead of the defending champ, Winter Park's Steve Griggs and Tom Fischer of Plantation turned in 69's.

Jones has posted recent victories in the Gasparilla and the West Central PGA tournaments.

The tournament continues here today with the championship flight in the 15-17 age group going off between 9:42 and 10:30. The 12-14 championship flight goes off at 9:18, 9:26 and 9:34.

Fischer Takes Title

WINTER HAVEN - Plantation's Tom Fischer overcame a one-stroke disadvantage to oust Bay Area first round leaders John Jones and John Reger and to capture the FSGA's Florida State Junior Championship here at Willow Brook yesterday.

turned Fischer 69-70-139 to edge Reger by one stroke. Jones, tied with Reger at 68 after Wednesday's first round, shot a 79 to skyrocket to 147 and 10th place.

Fischer credited his putting game for the victory. Last year he was tied for the lead with a 72 after the first round, but said he played his competitors then, instead of the course, and ballooned to a fat

win The FSGA Fischer's first big win. He said he profited from last year's mistakes.

Defending champion David Abell of Ft. Pierce wound up seventh overall after rounds of 70-74 for 144.

Third place in the upper division went to Terry May of Longwood who totaled a 141 after steady rounds of 71-70. Jeff Hollis of Largo was fourth at 142 and Tampa's Joe Hodge and Lauderhill's Pat Peecher shared fifth place at 143.

Lake Placid's Kevin Janiga captured the 12-14 age group with a 74-74-148 while Palatka's Billy Tuten was second at 149 and Lakeland's John Purcell was third at 151.

State Golf Association's junior tournament on the first day with an even par 72. The second day, he kept his eyes on the other contenders and shot 80.

This year Tom shot a 69 the first day of the FSGA junior played at Willow Brook. But he remembered last year's mistake and the second day he made an effort to ignore the opposition and play the golf course. He played it in 70 strokes, and won the championship.


Fischer won by one stroke over John Reger of Brandon. Reger was one of the first day leaders with 68 but he shot an even-par 72 the second day, which was one stroke too much.

Tampa's Johnny Jones, a pre-tournament favorite, shot 68 on Thursday without ever having seen Willow Brook before and then 79 on Friday.

Kevin Janiga of Lake Placid won the

12-14 age division.

It was his second title within a week. He won the 12-14 age division of Boys Invitational conducted by the Florida Women's State Golf Association at Lehigh Acres. Kevin plays at Sebring Municipal course and won the Crutchfield junior championship two years ago in the 12-and-under division.
