SERINE AND EARSLEY LEAD AFTER FIRST ROUND OF FLORIDA STATE MID-AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Apopka's Lance Serine and Wellington's Steve Earsley both shot a 1-under 71 to lead the Florida State Mid-Amateur Championship by one stroke over five other golfers after the first round of stroke play. Serine's round was highlighted by a hole-in-one on the 200-yard fifth hole at Timuquana Country Club in Jacksonville.

Standing in second place with an even-par 72 are: Tampa's Pipp Patton, Winter Park's Jim Byington, St. Augustine's Sean Pacetti, Jacksonville's Mike Bodney, and Naples' Ron Cleland.

Play continues Friday in this 25-and-over Championship with the second round of stroke play before the field of 90 golfers is trimmed to the low 16 scorers who will advance to match play.

The 16th score fell at 74, with many marquis players near that score. Two-time State Amateur champion and defending Mid-Amateur champion Mark Leetzow of Sarasota shot 73. Other former State Mid-Amateur champions in the running include: John Corzilius (1994 and 1997) of Nokomis and Doug LaCrosse (1995) of Tampa both with a 75, and Bruce Scamehorn (1993) of Winter Haven with a 77.

Chip Hitt, the current President of the FSGA, shot a 73, while Palm City's Paul Piccolo shot a 74 with 1992 U.S. Senior Open champion Larry Laoretti toting his bag.

Timuquana Country Club, a **Donald Ross** design, is a private course with a formidable history. Organized in 1923, Timuquana held the 1928 Florida State Amateur Championship. The course is similar to Ross's Pinehurst #2 with classic domed greens and closely-mowed chipping areas. The course is unique in that it wanders through thick pines and hundred-year old live oaks with no houses in sight. It is situated on relatively flat land, so the only topography is the raised greens.

The Florida State Mid-Amateur Championship is the 14th of 16 state championships conducted annually by the Florida State Golf Association.
