

DAYTONA BEACH -- Matt Every had just stepped away from the scorers table after his last round in the 47th Florida State Golf Association Junior Tuesday when he muttered what so many golfers everywhere have said time and again, "If only I had made that putt, I would've won this thing."

"That putt" the Mainland High student was referring to was a 360-degree lip-out birdie try at the Par-4 Legends course at LPGA International.

Finishing only one stroke behind tournament champion Robert Gates Jr. of Gainesville, Every shot a two-day 71-74-145 and joined three others in a four-player logjam.

After finishing one stroke behind first-day leader Curtis Elliot on the Champions course, the action switched to its sister course across the street, and Every carried his momentum through the front nine, making the turn at even-par.

Even though recent heavy rains caused wetter-than-normal course conditions and made for longer play by limiting ball roll, Every felt his short game was his strong suit for the most part.

"On top of stopping very quickly, the balls would pick up some mud and made the following shots less predictable," said Every. "But I made putts here to keep myself in it."

Every had picked up two birdies by the time he finished No. 12, but then promptly gave them back with a double-bogey on the dogleg-left par-4 13th.

"I doubled 13 when I chipped from one hazard into another hazard across from the first," said Every.

Nonetheless, Every felt he had a chance to make it up, feeling as though he could make birdies on at least two of the last three holes.

However, a topped fairway bunker shot on No. 16 and the lip-out on No. 17 cast a pall on his hopes to this year see his name join those of past FSGA Junior state champions Matt Kuchar, Gary Koch, Josh McCumber and Len Mattiace.

"Hey, Gates played a good game and he came out on top," Every saidof the tournament champion.
